## HERE COME THE HOLIDAYS

With the holidays approaching, many of us will give our front gardens a fall facelift. We all want our homes to have well dressed porches and front doors for our own enjoyment and to welcome friends and family that may visit. Many people are fearful about their ability to create an attractive fall entry that will coordinate with their home and provide curb appeal. Understanding color helps simplify the process and provides confidence that it is done well.



Autumn colors are more diverse and exciting than just yellow and orange. When you look out over a fall scene, you actually see a deep, varied palette ranging from light butter cream to cocoa, purple, red, blue-green, and black.

When choosing seasonal accents for the exterior of your home, you can always consult the magical color wheel. Complementary colors, opposites on the color wheel, create a vibrant look. Analogous colors adjoin on the color wheel, giving a soothing effect. Consider the colors or tones of your home's bricks, trim, and front door as well as its style. Using these easy references, your selection of containers, plants, and accessories is sure to be attractive



This home has little color in its structure or containers, allowing the wreath and gourd arrangements to be the standouts. The shape of the arch above the door echoes perfectly the curvature of the urn bowls.

This bold front door blends well with the warm tones of the brick and stone, however the tiny containers look lost. In our opinion, a pair of large amber glazed terra-cotta containers filled with abundant autumn plantings would have been ideal.



Here, a brown, cream, and pale blue outdoor rug anchors a trio of glazed terra-cotta containers with a brown standing rabbit for interest. The blues in the Indian Summer pillow echo the other blue pieces, knitting the group together. Color coordinated plantings repeating a common feature would enhance it further.

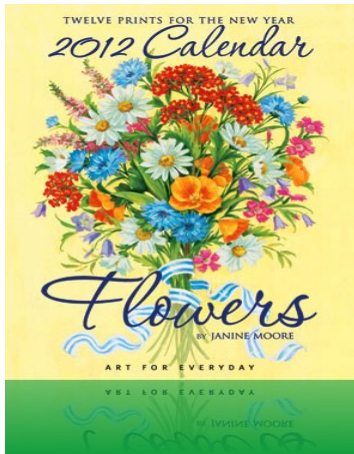

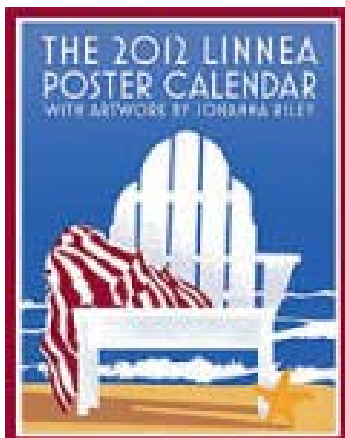
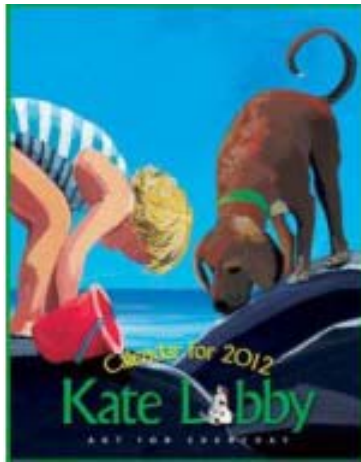
**IT WOULDN'T BE CHRISTMAS WITHOUT THESE CALENDARS!**

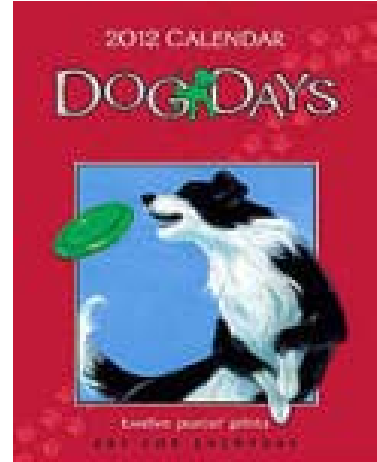

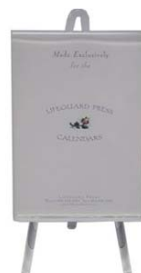
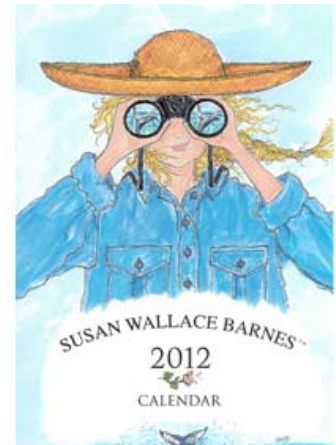

## QUICK POTATO LEEK SOUP

1 bunch leeks  
3 russet potatoes  
5 C Chicken stock  
¼ tsp Garlic powder  
Salt & Pepper to taste  
1 C Half & Half



Peel and dice potatoes; thinly slice the whites of leeks. Place in 6 qt. pot and cover with stock. Cook until potatoes are soft. Blend until smooth. Return to pot and add Half & Half, garlic powder and salt and pepper to taste. Enjoy this hearty cool weather meal.
